Open House #1: Public Input Report


October 2, 2023

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Introduction

The City of Frisco hosted its first open house event, asking the community for input related to the ongoing Comprehensive Plan's update, with topics ranging from the Plan's vision, guiding principles, and chapter-specific content. The in-person event was held on Thursday, August 24th, 2023, from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. at the Frisco Public Library. Approximately 100 people attended the meeting, in addition to members of the City Council, Planning & Zoning Commission, and City Staff. The City also hosted a virtual open house available from August 24th to September 7th. The virtual open house received 299 comments from 164 unique participants. This packet evaluates the full results from both the in-person and virtual events.









Green = Parks & Trails












2015 Future Land Use Map






