Re: Electioneering at Fire Stations used as Polling Places

The City of Frisco Fire Chief has determined that the placement of political signs and literature within fifteen feet (15') of areas defined as the primary departure points for fire vehicles when responding to an emergency – known as the “apparatus apron” – at fire stations being used as polling places is unsafe for electioneering and interferes with patrons and City employees and staff who use such areas other than for election purposes.

Accordingly, candidates and their supports are advised that placement of political signs and literature in these protected areas is restricted during voting periods pursuant to Section 54-204(a)(2) of the City's Code of Ordinances. Signs will be posted at fire stations being used as polling places to help identify the protected areas. Please contact the City Secretary's Office with any questions.

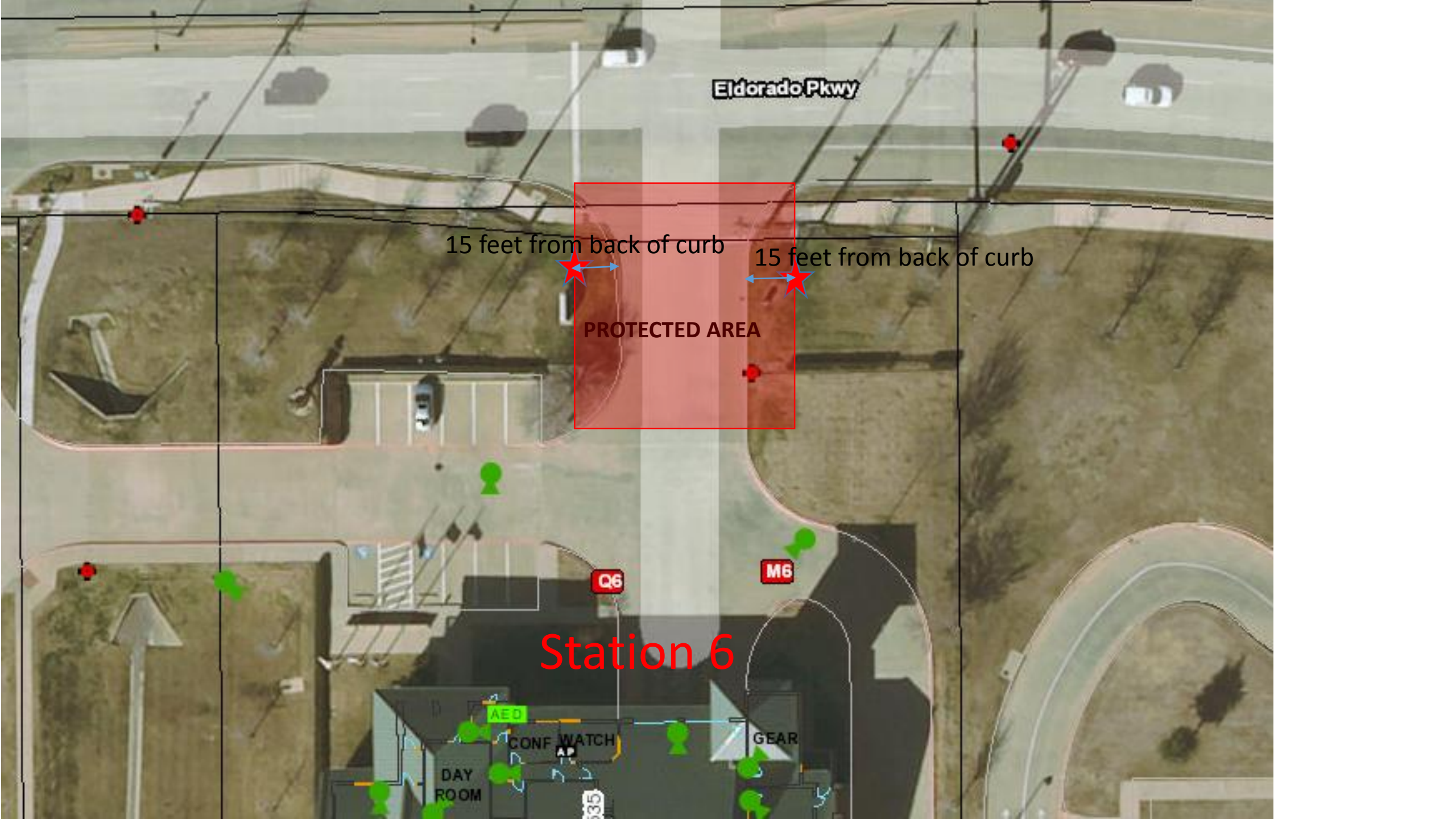
